Miss Myra and The Moonshiners from Minneapolis, Minnesota, bring an infectious blend of hot jazz and swing that will have audiences tapping their toes. Their powerful vocals, a smoking horn section, and sweet rhythm are guaranteed to lift spirits and fill the dance floor.

Also hailing from the Twin Cities is <u>Lonesome Dan Kase</u>, a blues troubadour whose raw, emotive performances evoke the timeless spirit of the Mississippi Delta. Lonesome Dan's heartfelt lyrics and haunting melodies transport listeners to a bygone era of smoky juke joints and moonlit crossroads.

The West Fork Gals are a five-member-strong all-female string band who are emerging as local favorites. They say, "We started as a square dance band, and that was certainly fun. Then we started singing together and that was super fun. We love the old songs and making harmonies, we love traditional music and also have some originals. And we love sharing it!" Don't miss this chance to see them step up to the stage!
